

A Gift of Light

The Pension Fund, as "Innkeeper" stands ready to assist those who serve within the churches and who come our way in time of need. In Luke 10:34-35, the innkeeper demonstrates for us the model of a willing servant, one that moves forward in faith. Many have helped the Pension Fund carry out this symbolic function of the Innkeeper's readiness to serve at all hours, whenever there is need. It symbolizes the Pension Fund's commitment to service and care, even in those darkest hours of our life and ministry.

On November 18, 2010, the Pension Fund honored Adelle Lemon and her late husband, Robert, with the designation of "Innkeeper". An Innkeeper's fund is established with a gift of \$100,000 immediately or through accumulated gifts of \$100,000 or more to the Ministerial Relief fund. The following article, A Gift of Light, written by Adelle Lemon, tells a little history of the Lemon family ministry.

Both Robert and I were raised in loving, Christian families where giving was an integral part of our life and concern for others was daily fare.

My mother kept a record of some of my bedtime prayers when I was three years old, one of which asked God to help the poor people who did not have enough to eat. We were conscious of them at every meal as we thanked God for our food.

Before I began attending school, and for some years, my weekly allowance was five cents. Daddy had put dividers into an empty cigar box. (He smoked one cigar each Sunday.) On the white lining paper we had written the designation for each section. One penny went to "Sunday School", one to "Church", one to "Birthdays", one to "Christmas", and one to "Savings". It never occurred to my sister or me that there could have been a category for ourselves!

Robert's history was similar. He had no room of his own, sleeping on an unheated porch, even in Chicago winters, or on the sofa, and never a whole closet or dresser of his own. During and after the Depression, his father, a Disciples pastor in Chicago, planted vegetables in the churchyard to feed his family, because there was not enough space for this around the various apartment buildings where the family lived. *continued on page 2*

Each of us was fortunate in never having to go hungry. Many strangers came to our door (always the back door) asking for work so they could earn some money. Mother always invited them in and fed them a hearty meal.

What a boon to our families that both Robert and I won full scholarships for our university education! His seminary training was also paid for because he was one of the Disciples Divinity House scholars at the University of Chicago.

Health care was essential for both of our mothers who had serious health problems. My mother's heart was severely damaged, with frightening episodes when her life was in danger. Many a time I heard her tell my father, "Don't bother the doctor." Of course, that meant she was in need of medical attention but knew that we didn't have the money to pay for it. The bills piled up. Daddy was paying on them for two or three years after her early death at age 49. To this day, when I voice some physical complaint to my family, I hear myself adding, "Don't bother the doctor!"

Robert's mother was raised in Hamden, Connecticut, next door to New Haven, where the first telephone company in the United States was established. Her father was one of the founding members of the Southern New England Telephone Company. At his death, his shares of stock went to her. At the time of our marriage, she gave us the right to buy ten shares. I was unacquainted with the world of stock and had no idea how valuable this gift would prove to be.

We established a special bank account for the dividends, which amounted to \$1.25 each quarter, or \$5.00 a year. I imagine the bank workers must have laughed at such a tiny deposit, but it was a big deal to us! When the deposits eventually totaled enough to buy one more share of stock every few years, we celebrated. And so it went. I didn't know that

some people bought 50 or 100 shares at a time.

We started to invest in other companies, whose treatment of their workers, policies and products met our concern for social justice. Before we bought these stocks, Robert learned this information. Gradually, we accumulated a sizable portfolio over our 57 years together.

Since we were raised to think "Tithes and Offerings," we felt a growing joy in being able to give more and more.

There were some very lean years along the way. Robert was awarded a Religion in Higher Education grant from the Danforth Foundation for a year of advanced study. The dollar amount was exactly half of his salary as minister of Bethany Memorial Church in Bethany, West Virginia, and teacher of New Testament at Bethany College. What an adjustment!

He chose to take that year of study at Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley, California. We rented two small bedrooms and shared the kitchen and living room with the landlady. The price was right, and she became our friend. But even though "Frugal" could have been my middle name, it was a struggle. We'll never forget the

day when the 3 lb. jar of peanut butter got dropped and broke into many pieces! It was to be our source of protein for weeks! I sat on the floor and cried. How was I to feed my four little children and Robert and myself? It was difficult, but we survived that life-changing year.

We remained in Berkeley so Robert could work on his doctorate. I took in two other children for daycare, and eventually became a social worker. Robert and I and our children lived modestly, even while surrounded by people of greater financial means. This was hard on our children, harder than we realized at the time.

Now I have the joy of seeing our children carry on the tradition of giving to worthy causes, and teaching their children the connection between morality and money.

During all our years, we were keenly aware of elderly ministers and widows who struggled to make ends meet in their retirement years, and clergy friends serving congregations which had not joined the Pension Fund. Often they had to choose between putting food on the table and getting needed medical care.

The Biblical doctrine of property does not deal with ownership; it deals only with stewardship. This applies

to Robert and me and equally to the Pension Fund. Our property was not so much about how much we had gathered, but much more about how blessed we were and thus how we could share God's blessings with others. The mission of our Christian Church Pension Fund is to care for its own; the retired, the disabled, the aged, the widowed and the orphaned. Our gift was simply responding to the Biblical mandate, just as the Pension Fund does, decade after decade.
